Dear Sir/Madam:

Benga Mining Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary of Riversdale Resources Limited, is proposing to construct and operate an open-pit metallurgical coal mine near the Crowsnest Pass, approximately seven kilometers north of the community of Blairmore, in southwest Alberta. As proposed, the production capacity of the project would be a maximum of 4.5 million tonnes of clean coal per year, over a mine life of about 25 years.

The Tsuut'ina Nation does not object to the above named application and its related applications on the basis that Benga has adequately addressed its project-specific concerns. The Tsuut'ina Nation is therefore of the view that Benga's consultation should be deemed adequate. As a result of our work with Benga, the Tsuut'ina Nation supports the development of the Project.

Nothing in this letter shall be interpreted in a manner that extinguishes, abrogates or diminishes the Tsuut'ina Nation's Indigenous or Treaty Rights, including Aboriginal Title, which are protected under section 35 of the Constitution Act.
